



State Budget Appropriations Over Time and Budget Proposals
















Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) Recipients in the State


Median Household Income in New Hampshire

American Community Survey Estimates, Inflation-Adjusted




New Hampshire Inflation-Adjusted Wages by Relative Income

Anti-Poverty Program Enrollment by Municipality


Municipal Medicaid Enrollment, January 2017


Percent of Municipal Medicaid Enrollment as of January 2017 by 2010 Census Population




Percentage of Population Enrolled in Food Stamp Program by Municipality


Percentage of Students Identified as Eligibile for Free and Reduced-Price Lunch









Median Rental Costs and Vacancy Rates in New Hampshire


Median Monthly Gross Rent for Two-Bedroom Apartments and All Units, Two-Bedroom Apartment Statewide Vacancy Rate



■Two-Bedroom Vacancy Rate —Two-Bedroom Median Gross Rent ——All Units Median Gross Rent


Median Rents for Two-Bedroom Apartments by County

2018 New Hampshire Residential Rental Cost Survey, New Hampshire Housing Finance Authority






Multiple Listing Services Home Listings by Price, Twelve-Month Rolling Average




New Hampshire Residential Unit Construction

Single-Family and Multi-Family Units Authorized Annually, Seasonally-Adjusted












