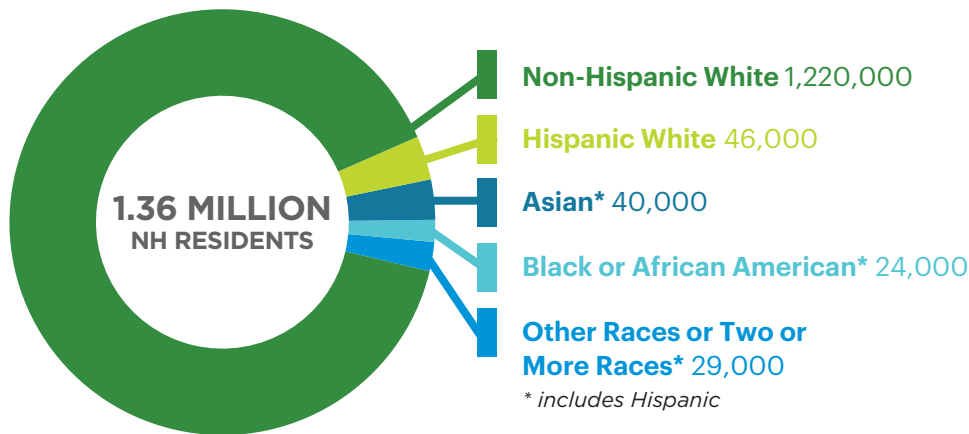


Population Groups by Race and Ethnicity in New Hampshire

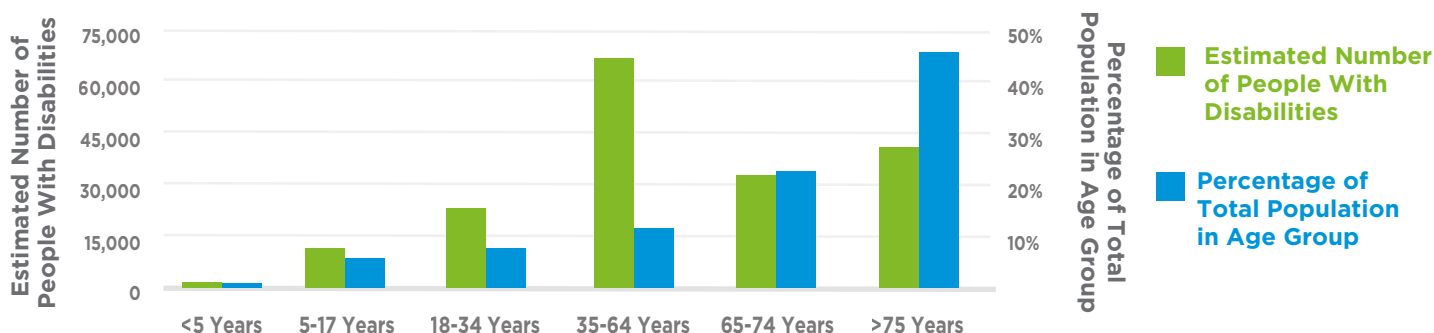

New Hampshire's population under age 65 declined by about **33,000** people from 2010 to 2019, while the population aged 65 and older grew by **74,000**



Between 2000 and 2010, New Hampshire's population under age 65 increased by about **50,000** people, while the population aged 65 and older grew by **30,000**
