



AVERAGE ANNUAL POPULATION CHANGE IN NEW HAMPSHIRE BY DECADE



STATE POPULATION WOULD BE DECLINING WITHOUT MIGRATION IN RECENT YEARS



INTERNATIONAL MIGRATION CREATED MORE THAN HALF OF 2010-2022 GROWTH





Hispanic Residents Included in Race Categories Where Not Otherwise Noted





INCOME AND BUSINESS ACTIVITY FROM IMMINGRANTS SIGNIFICANT IN ECONOMY

- 2022 data: Median individual income for foreign born residents in New Hampshire was about \$47,000, with income estimated for approximately 83,000 foreign born individuals
 - Total income would be \$3.9 billion if all foreign born residents earned that median income level in 2022
- About one in ten businesses in New Hampshire that were owned by individuals and had employees were owned by someone not born in the United States in 2021

• About one percent were owned by non-citizens


- About 9 percent of nonemployer firms in New Hampshire were owned by people who were not born in the U.S. in 2019
 - Nearly 5 percent of nonemployer businesses were owned by people who were not U.S. citizens
