

NUMBER OF JOB OPENINGS PER NEW HAMPSHIRE RESIDENT ACTIVELY SEEKING WORK







As Reported by Employers Participating in State Unemployment Compensation System,






Year and Quarter End of Four Quarter Rolling Average

AVERAGE ANNUAL POPULATION CHANGE IN NEW HAMPSHIRE BY DECADE





INTERNATIONAL AND DOMESTIC MIGRATION EQUALLY IMPORTANT IN 2010-2023
















MEDIAN MONTHLY PRICE OF A TWO-BEDROOM UNIT IN 2024: \$1,833

Child Care Tuition Prices for Center-Based and Family Child Care for Infants and Toddlers





SIGNIFICANT NUMBER OF NH HOUSEHOLDS WITH LOW INCOMES OR IN POVERTY

- Median household income in New Hampshire about \$97,000 in 2023
- About 1 in 4 New Hampshire households had incomes below \$50,000 in 2023 data
- About 11 percent had incomes below \$25,000 in 2023
- Almost 16 percent had incomes at or above \$200,000
- Average New Hampshire household size was 2.39 people (2.91 for average family)
- U.S. median household income about \$77,700, households slightly larger at 2.49 people on average (3.09 per family)





KEY TAKEAWAYS

- Workforce availability is likely the largest constraint on economic growth within New Hampshire
- Long-term demographics suggest that New Hampshire will need to support more in-migration to grow the population and workforce
- The lack of availability and affordability of housing and child care limit growth of the workforce and the ability of people to move to New Hampshire
- Granite Staters face high costs while many households and individuals have limited incomes relative to living cost estimates
- Incomes are much higher in the southeastern part of the state, and vary substantially by race and ethnicity
- Communities have different fiscal capacities to invest in themselves, and property taxes have higher effective rates for lower income households
