







Projections by Age Group, for 2020 to 2050








WORKFORCE AGE PROJECTIONS 2022 TO 2032





Births Minus Deaths, International, and Domestic Net-Migration, from April 1, 2020 to July 1, 2023





Estimates of Net Migration in 2021 and 2022 Combined, Excluding New England States









New Hampshire Statewide Data, Two Bedroom Apartments





TRUE COST OF HIGH-QUALITY CHILD CARE

- Revenue from tuition and NH Child Care Scholarships may not generate enough funds to cover necessary program costs
- Costs may include:
 - Payroll and benefits
 - o Professional development for staff
 - Food and diapers
 - o Toys, furniture, and playground equipment
 - Curricula and assessments
 - o Reducing child to teacher ratios, as needed
 - Cleaning supplies
 - o Rent or Mortgage
 - o Insurance
 - Utilities
 - Additional office and business expenses
- Difficult to streamline or consolidate child care costs due to unique
 business model
