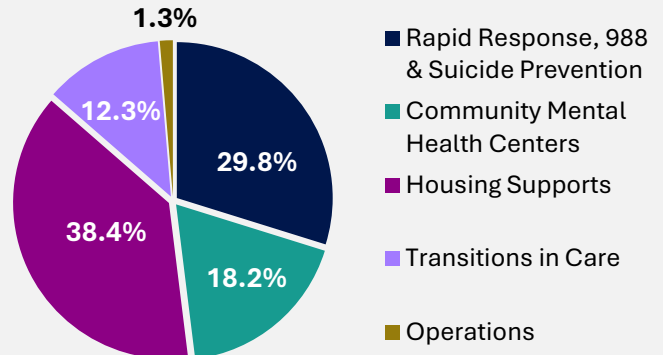


Community Mental Health Program Account (Accounting Unit 4117)

The Community Mental Health Program Account (Accounting Unit (AU) 4117) funds critical programs that help New Hampshire residents during a mental health challenge. Funding from this account supports the 10 community mental health centers, peer and family agencies, crisis services, housing programs and suicide prevention activities.

These programs ensure that people have safe, appropriate living environments while receiving the level of care they need. The programs funded by the Community Mental Health Program Account helps thousands of Granite Staters live and work independently in our communities.

Percent of Services Covered in AU 4117, as Recommended by the Governor



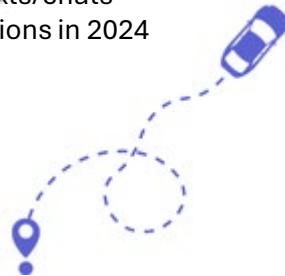
