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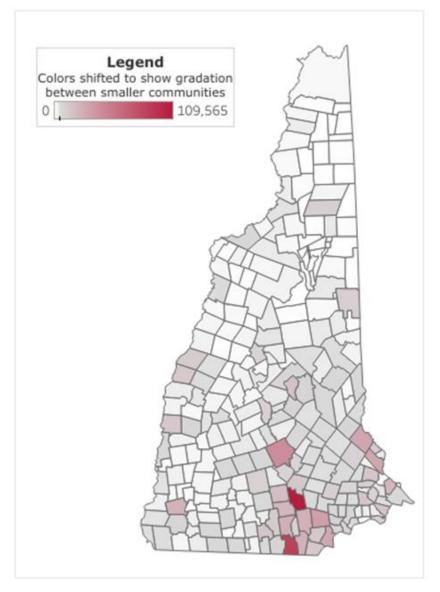

Population Distribution and Median Ages

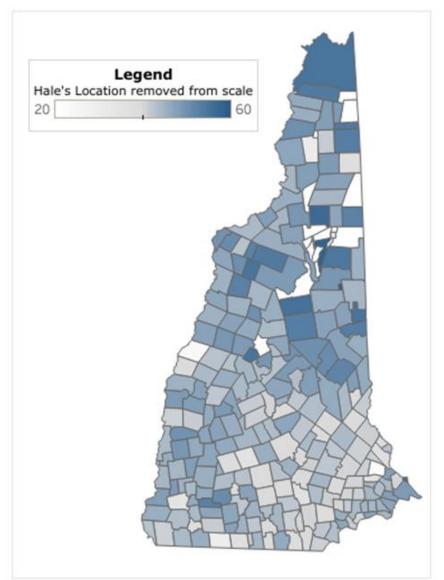







New Hampshire, Changes from 2010 to 2018



Change from April 1, 2010 to July 1, 2018







- Poverty for a family of three, with two adults and one child: \$20,212
- Estimated Poverty Rate:
 7.6 percent 100,000 people
- Estimated Child Poverty Rate (Under 18):
 10.6 percent 27,000 children
- Estimated Poverty Rate, Ages 18-64:
 7.3 percent 60,000 people
- Estimated Poverty Rate, Ages 65 and Up:
 5.5 percent 13,000 people


Poverty Rates Higher for Certain Groups


New Hampshire Poverty Rates by Age Group






Percent of Tax Filers in 2015 With Over \$100,000 Reported Income

Municipal Median Household Income Relative to State Median Household Income



Anti-Poverty Program Enrollment by Municipality

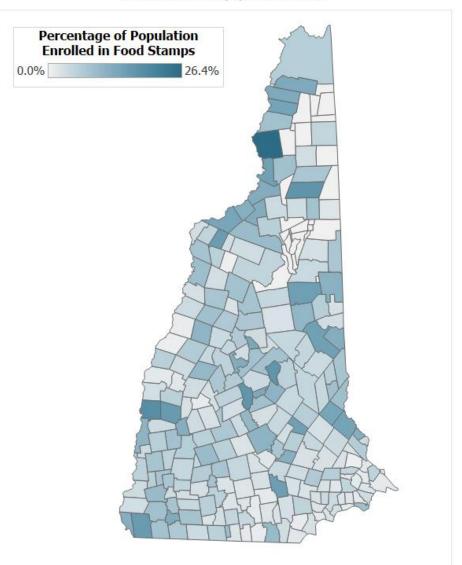
Percentage of Population Enrolled in Medicaid by Municipality

Percentage of Population Enrolled in Food Stamp Program by Municipality



County Educational Attainment, 2013-2017


Population Ages 25 and Up With an Associate's Degree or Higher, New Hampshire Counties



Cost of Living in New Hampshire: Two Adults, One Child








Cost of Living: One Adult, Two Children




MIT Estimates of Annual Family Living Costs

EPI Estimates of Annual Family Living Costs





- Approximately 42,000 New
 Hampshire households estimated to have been food insecure within the past year, based on 2016-2018 data
- The Food Stamp Program, also known as the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (commonly called SNAP), provided food assistance to about 74,000 individuals, about 39 percent of whom were children and about 9 percent over age 64, in October 2019
